From a serene sanctuary in Siem Reap to sky-high dining with vertiginous views, we explore this month's new openings



Inner sanctum

Treeline is the first hotel from Hok Kang, founder of Phnom Penh-based architects HKA & Partners, and co-founder of Brown Coffee, the country's much-loved coffee-shop chain, of which there is a branch next door. Kang's vision for the 48-room hotel combines a minimalist aesthetic with midcentury influences and uses sustainably-sourced native timber and stone throughout. A leafy inner courtyard sports an installation, Cosmic Wheel, by the HKA team, with art forming a key part of the hotel's ethos as it showcases around 50 works by leading Cambodian artists, including Sopheap Pich and Sothea Thang. Other elements include an ayurvedic spa and rooftop infinity pool with poolside bar, breakfast restaurant Seed, and the airy Hok Noodle Bar and Grill, which serves pan-Asian dishes under a colourful wall mural.
